Police priorities are then set by the local community and we work with you, together and with other agencies to find a lasting solution.

### You said, we did

You told us that anti-social behaviour (ASB) by young people and drug dealing and using was a concern of the community. We have acted on this information making them our priority. Here are some of the many ways we are tackling these issues.

#### Anti-social behaviour (ASB) by groups of young people

- We have carried out covert and high visibility patrols.
- We continue to engage with groups of young people using stop and search powers where necessary.
- We have carried out decoy moped operations and arrested anyone found stealing mopeds.
- We continue to engage youths offering advice and information on local diversionary projects.
- Working with the Council and other partners an Anti-Social Behaviour Order (ASBO) was obtained in November and others are being considered.
- The Council has served notices of demotion for breaches of tenancy conditions and taken action through the Courts to prevent and help change problem behaviour.

#### **Drugs dealing and using**

- We have carried out covert and high visibility patrols.
- We have carried out a community safety meet and greet event in Plot 10.
- We have been gathering evidence from residents about possible drugs addresses.
- We continue to look at persistent offenders with a view to obtaining Anti Social Behaviour Orders (ASBOs).

If you would like to have your say on what the priorities in St Pancras and Somers Town should be you are welcome to attend our drop-in surgeries. These meetings provide you with an opportunity to meet the team and discuss your local policing concerns with us.

## Policing Pledge update

As part of the Policing Pledge we will ensure your Safer Neighbourhoods Team are visible and on your patch at times when they will be most effective and when you tell us you most need them. We will ensure your team is not taken away from neighbourhood business more than is absolutely necessary. They will spend at least 80% of their time visibly working in your neighbourhood, tackling your priorities.

As part of the Policing Pledge we have introduced a new phone service called the 'pledgeline'. This improves our ability to answer calls when your Safer Neighbourhoods Team is unavailable.

When the team is away from the office or off duty your calls to them will be diverted and you will be transferred automatically to the pledgeline. Staff will register your call and forward it on to the relevant team. Although the pledgeline is not 24 hours it is staffed outside of usual working hours and the voicemail system is checked over the weekend. Your Safer Neighbourhoods Team wants to hear from you, this line will ensure that your feedback is heard and dealt with.

The pledgeline should not be used to report crimes that are currently happening, in these instances please continue to use either 999 or 0300 123 1212.

# Update from safer Neighbourhood panel chair



I have been on the panel in different capacities for about three and a half years. Our panel is made up of local councillors and representatives from your tenants and resident associations. Our role is to discuss what the issues that concern the community are and what we, as representatives, want the police Safer Neighbourhoods Team to deal with as priorities.

We meet about every eight weeks and I can say the panel's joint working with the Safer Neighbourhoods Team and council has thus far been a success. My message would always be tell the police what you're concerned about so they know about it and don't allow unknown callers in your block or estate to prevent crime.
